

It was the fall of 2016 when filmmaker Jonathan Harris and I left the Collins River Valley and drove up the mountain to Beersheba Springs, Tennessee to interview Howell Adams. Our goal was to capture something of his life



experiences and reflections as a husband, father, friend, businessman, philanthropist, and man of faith.



We arrived in a golden cloud of falling leaves, a burst of color that was a brilliant metaphor for the work that followed. We spent multiple days with Howell and his wife, Madeline, as he looked back on his life from the vantage point of more than eight decades. 'In many ways,

my twilight years are the best years of all,' Howell told us. 'They allow more time for deepening my relationships, and for reflection and prayer.'

We quickly learned that for Howell the glass is seldom half full or half empty, but instead running over with delight and gratitude. For him, each new conversation and experience becomes an opportunity for a joyful, enriching encounter.



Howell brought to the making of this video a near photographic memory and an attention to detail that made for a rich telling of his family's history. We learned that his spirit of adventure



is rooted in the safe haven provided by a large and extended family that has gathered in Beersheba Springs for almost 150 years. On hiking trails, in swimming holes, and around the dining room table of the legendary White House, new generations of cousins are still forging relationships as they weave the past and present into an enduring family story.



The character traits that Howell developed in childhood were carried into adulthood—an abiding faith in God, loyalty to family, a willingness to take decisive action, and to 'give until it feels good.'

These qualities provided a foundation for business success as well as philanthropy. It was his faith in God that supported him through the illness and death of his daughter, Madeline.






The extended time
